IS YOUR CHARITY TACKLING HEALTH INEQUALITIES?

Our 'Partners for Health' grants are now open for applications for projects that can demonstrate:

Positive outcomes for people facing significant barriers to health*

A new approach or thoughtful development of service

Partnership between health and community organisations.

Successful projects

- Be in partnership with a health agency or charity partner,
- Are knowledgeable about the sector in which they operate,
- Will share project findings.

Grant Details

- Grants range between £3,000 and £15,000 (the average award is £8,000)
- Usually for one year beginning in 2024.

Who can apply?

- Registered charities in London,
- Supporting vulnerable people to improve their health,
- Priority is given to charities with an annual income of <£500,000.
- Previous grantees are welcome to apply if developing a new initiative.

*This can include people with disabilities, age related and long term progressive health conditions and those experiencing homelessness

HOW TO APPLY

The deadline for applications is 5:00pm on **Friday 31st May 2024****



Shortlisted applicants will be informed by Friday 14th June 2024



Shortlisted applicants will be invited to present to an interview panel



Interviews will take place on Wednesday 31st July 2024



A final decision will be made after the interview.

** It is advisable to submit applications in good time, those submitted after the closing date will not be accepted.

Previous Partners for Health projects include:

- **The Anne Robson Trust:** £8,223 to work with two hospitals, Chelsea & Westminster and Northwick Park, to set up teams of volunteers to visit patients in the last days of their life.
- **Healthwatch Camden:** £15,160 for a peer-led support network and awareness campaign for girls and women in Camden living with endometriosis.
- **Vision Care for Homeless People:** £5,440 to pilot a mobile optician's service for homeless people, providing sight tests, eye screening and glasses.
- **Headway West London:** £6,000 for an Outreach Link Worker to develop collaboration with St Mary's Hospital trauma unit, to involve survivors of acquired brain injury and their families in supporting their rehabilitation.
- **E17 Puppet Project:** £5,774 to co-produce a community arts project, lesson plans and resources with young people living with sickle cell disease attending the Rainbow Centre for blood transfusions.
