

'PARTNERS FOR HEALTH' 2021

NOW OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS FOR PROJECTS THAT CAN DEMONSTRATE:

- Positive outcomes **for people facing significant barriers to health***
- A new approach or **thoughtful development** of service
- **Partnership** between health and community organisations.

WHO CAN APPLY?

- Registered charities operating in London,
- Supporting vulnerable people to improve their health,
- Priority is given to charities with an annual income of <£500,000 and which have not previously received a 'Partners for Health' grant.

SUCCESSFUL PROJECTS

- Will be clear about what they want to achieve and how,
- Work in partnership with a health agency or community partner,
- Are knowledgeable about the sector in which they operate,
- Willing to disseminate project findings.

GRANT DETAILS

- Grant range between £3,000 and £10,000 (the average award is £5,000)
- Usually for one year beginning in 2021.

HOW TO APPLY

Apply online via the [London Catalyst website](#), choose the Project form

The deadline for receipt of applications is 5:00pm on Thursday 3rd June 2021*

- Shortlisted applicants will be informed by **15th June 2021**
- Shortlisted applicants will be invited to present to an interview panel
- **Interviews will take place on Monday 21st June 2021**
- A final decision will be made after the interview.

* includes people with disabilities, age related and long-term health conditions and social determinants of health such as homelessness

** It is advisable to submit applications in good time, those submitted after the closing date will not be accepted.

CASE STUDIES OF PREVIOUS 'PARTNERS FOR HEALTH' PROJECTS

The Magpie Project: £6,500 to investigate barriers and facilitators to accessing health services for parents of under-fives living in temporary accommodation

'Mothers identified common barriers to accessing healthcare, including digital exclusion, financial exclusion (e.g. insufficient funds to travel to appointments), lack of information, and lack of trust in the safety and/or navigation of these services'

Vision Care for Homeless People: £5,440 to pilot a mobile optician's service for homeless people, providing sight tests, eye screening and glasses for homeless patients.

Headway West London: £6,000 for an Outreach Link Worker to develop collaboration with St Mary's Hospital trauma unit, to involve survivors of acquired brain injury and their families in supporting their rehabilitation.

E17 Puppet Project: £5,774 to co-produce a community arts project, lesson plans and resources with young people living with sickle cell disease attending the Rainbow Centre for blood transfusions.
